

The module consists of testimonies based on lived experience, group exercises, a presentation and an interactive discussion and Q& A with the class. The aim of these sessions was to provide trainee social workers with a more dynamic and holistic understanding of the lives and daily experiences of those who are experiencing poverty, people they will be working with in the future.

## Key issues families we work with face with social workers

## **Positive Practice**

Often people only hear the negative stories about social workers and we don't hear about all the positive work

It's important to recognise the positive practice that takes place!



## It's time to build a good, constructive relationship together ©

"The social workers are often changed, you can have a lot of different social workers in your life in a short time and in my opinion this doesn't help us build a strong relationship."





Social workers carry a lot of power - parents can often feel powerless in the relationship.

The stakes can be extremely high to the point of losing a child into the care system.

Recognizing this power disproportion is important!



### <u>Fear</u>

When a social worker comes to the door, you are filled with fear ... fear based on what you have heard from others. You may have done nothing wrong but the fear still comes. I am not sure that even the social workers know how much power they have in the eyes of a parent.

Power is something very important, and needs to be addressed. A parent can feel powerless in the face of a social worker and this can lead to fear, shame, guilt and a backdown in the relationship.



## **Feeling Judged**

People are often judged on their past, you could have gone through a rough patch a few years back and moved on since then, but it can still go against you. It could be on record and turn up and go against you even though you have changed and things are going well.




## The Cycle of Poverty



- Intergenerational Poverty trap
- Deep rooted systematic factors
- Affects core trunk of being
- Inside Out
- Limited branches of individual opportunity
- Physical and Mental health effects
- Possibility of resilience/hope
- Falling leaves of struggle/hardship
- Rebirth of difficult cycle for future children of family/community
