Role and Function

- To establish the role of mental health services in the implementation of National Housing Strategy for Disabled People (NHSPD), as it applies to people living with mental health issues.
- To develop effective partnerships with both internal and external stakeholders and seek to embed evidenced based models of practice which create sustainable pathways to housing for people living with mental health issues.
- Coordinate and facilitate associated activities bespoke to the identified housing needs in each CHO region.

HE Challenges

- No clear national strategy for addressing the long-term housing and support needs of people with severe and enduring mental illness
- Need for greater emphasis on supporting independent living working in a recovery orientated manner
- Lack of available housing units for service users to move to, particularly single units
- Lack of accurate housing data within MHS

Opportunities

- Clarify what MHS want to achieve
- Enhance existing inter-agency relationships
- Ensure consistent level of support for people moving into tenancies
- Assist local authorities
- Support the work of key internal partners---Social Workers!
