Responding to the Far-Right

Respond vs Reactionary

When to have a conversation and unpack(difficult conversation)

When to shut it down

How to ensure that you are not reinforcing false narratives

How to ensure you are not antagonising people/further alienate them

Not giving the Far-Right Oxygen by playing into their hand

Facts and Misinformation-

What discriminatory messaging is being spread in communities

What misinformation is out there i.e. its immigrants' fault

Immigrants are causing the housing crisis, unvetted men are committing crimes (racist myth)

What are the Facts ie a housing crisis, poverty

Racism is a reality in Ireland

The government has failed to provide affordable housing for all

Framing-how best to respond to these messages in social work

How do you move the conversation from the FR talking points

Changing the narrative to a value based narrative

Telling stories that draw on our shared values to connect people

The history of migration of Irish people

Support – support for social workers in managing these scenarios

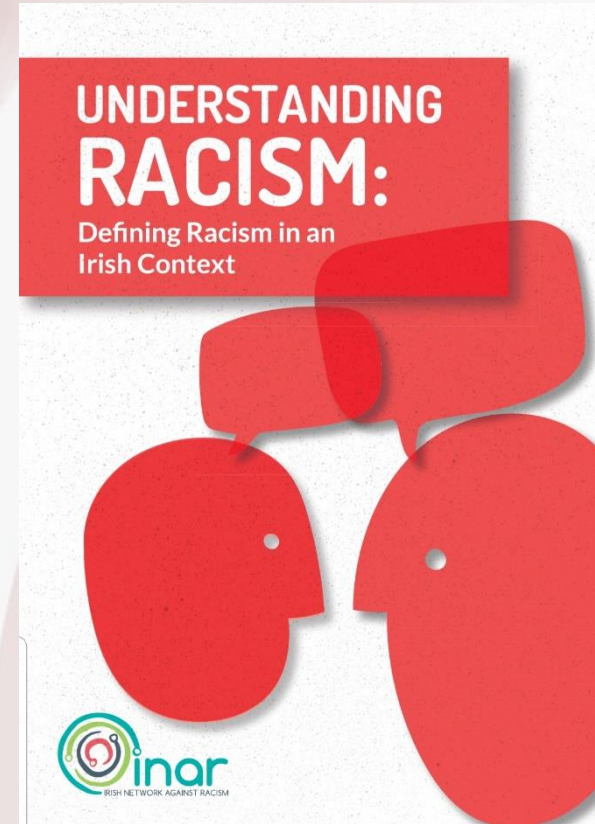
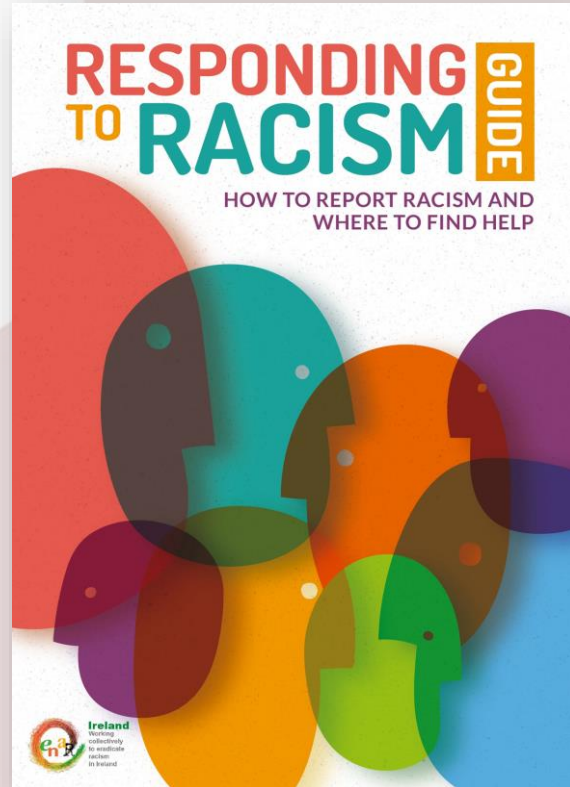
What do you need to build your confidence
