There is plenty happening in the IASW already this year. Notably the Board of Directors have signed off on the new Strategic Plan 2025-2027. Thank you to the SIG chairs that I spoke to. You all gave me so much of your time and expertise to help inform the focus for the IASW in the coming years. Huge thank you to our volunteer Board of Directors who gave up a full day in November and read numerous drafts before we got it right!



Thankfully, I am surrounded by talent in the IASW team with Katie and Danielle assisting in formatting and design work to help make the plan come alive.

Clíona has outlined a year full of great CPD events including collaborations with government departments, other Health and Social Care professionals and of course our own SIG network. Please do consider attending an event this year that may not directly relate to your own area of work. You will get to meet new people, build your own understanding of other areas of social work, and I don't doubt find overlap whatever your area of employment is.

I intend this year to encourage SIG collaboration. Many of you are experiencing similar challenges in your workplaces as well as developing excellent solutions, policy drafting, submissions, opinions, expert analysis- the talent is all available within the IASW.

Please do remember that you are not automatically part of a SIG unless you contact the office and request to be included in the mailing list. You do not have to be employed in a certain area in order to join a SIG- you can join simply for information, to build your own capacity and to engage in CPD beyond your usual subject matter.

Many of you will be aware that the IASW have a voluntary Board of Directors and attached to that Board are a number of committees. Each committee must have a director from the Board on it, but committee members do not have to be directors. There are some current vacancies on committees and all board committees and will require new volunteers after the AGM in May. Opportunities like this can provide an opportunity to develop a skillset you may not have exposure to in your workplace and can also prepare you for taking on a role as a Director on a Board. The beauty of a Board committee is that they have similar governance to the main board but a single focus. Committees of the board include 1. the Finance and Audit Committee 2. the Membership Committee 3. the Elections and Nominations and committee 4. the HR, Risk and Governance Committee, 5. the Continuous Professional Development Committee, 6. the International Affairs and 7. the Journal Committee. You must be a member of the IASW to join a committee unless you have a particular skill that is applicable to the committee (e.g. accountant, marketing, H.R.). If you or someone you know would be interested in becoming involved in a Committee we would love to hear from you!

Ongoing work being carried out by the volunteer members of the IASW include;
The Child and Family SIG are continuing to engage with TUSLA, DECDIY and CAHMS in relation to Special Emergency Arrangements and the Tusla Integrated Reform programme. The C&F SIG urgently needs a new chair or the SIG will close.

The Head Medical Social Workers will be hosting a Town Hall to explore the positives, opportunities and concerns in relation to advocacy posts in hospitals. The IASW also wrote to SAGE advocacy, The HSE CEO and CORU with concerns relating to a recent job description for advocacy posts.

The Adult Safeguarding team are continuing to liaise with the Department of Health to contribute to updating legislation and policy.

The ARAG committee are running a number of anti-racism events and exploring the possibility of carrying out research on racism in Ireland.

The IASW continues to represent it's members with statements and press releases for topical issues that emerge.

The IASW wrote to Minister Heather Humphries following the major weather events to explore the possibility of a specific fund to assist people directly affected by extreme weather. In conjunction with this a new working group has been established to explore eco-social work and the impact environmental change is having on society. If you are interested in joining this new working group please contact us in the office. It is in it's early stages but we are keen to explore environmental sustainability, the impact of climate change and climate justice on communities.
